OBJECTIVES

1. Define the four steps of every capacity assessment
2. Examine the different aspects of financial capacity
3. Evaluate the role of psychiatric symptomatology in capacity to live alone
4. Describe how to modify dementia assessment to include a focus on the experiences of people with dementia while evaluating the cognitive and behavioral changes associated with dementia
5. Identify tools to measure non-cognitive targets
6. Describe the perspective, values, and experiences of the person with dementia in the assessment process
7. Identify the value of self reports of people with dementia in the assessment process
8. Recognize the subjective nature of pain
9. Describe how pain may be expressed by those with memory loss, including how it may differ from those with normal cognition
10. Identify assessment tools for measuring pain in people with dementia
11. Discuss non-pharmacological approaches to pain management
12. Describe different techniques of stress management for mindful caregiving
13. Identify community resources available to caregivers with respect to Alzheimer's disease
14. Describe coping strategies and safety issues from the viewpoint of the caregiver
